Request for Information: Freedom of Information Act

Thank you for your email of 1 December, making a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act. You requested the following information and the Trust provided the information below in response:

Request:

Please now provide full financial details of all personal or business accounts held at Companies House or off-shore, as public servants you are required to provide full disclosure of your funds and what associations or business associations you are related to or do business with.

All Boards or Trusts you belong to, dividend payments, consultancy fees, payrolls you are on, all additional names you use, tenders you have been involved with either issuing or receiving, shares and what companies they are, capital gains, company's, charities, all financial dealings for yourselves and family members. As public servant you are required to provide this information openly (to prevent fraud, bias, insider dealing, corruption, manipulation, intimidation, inducement) Please include all off-shore details. I have supplied a list to SFO already. You would help yourselves by providing full details. Please also be mindful of Perverting Justice Laws.

Response:

This information is accessible by other means and the Trust has applied section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act to this request.

The Trust has considered if the request is vexatious and whether to apply section 14(1) as the scope of the request is personal in nature, and is targeted at particular individuals within the Trust. The Trust considers that section 14(1) is potentially engaged, is not applying it at this point but reserves the right to apply it.

If you are unhappy with the service you have received in relation to your request and wish to make a complaint or request a review of our decision, you should write to me and I will ensure the decision is reviewed. The Trust will consider undertaking a review if requested to do so within 40 working days of the date the response is received by the applicant, and will apply discretion if a longer period of time has passed.

Should you wish to make a complaint as a result of the outcome of such a review, you may apply directly to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) for a decision.

Generally, the ICO cannot make a decision unless you have exhausted the complaints procedure provided by the Trust for FoI Act matters.
