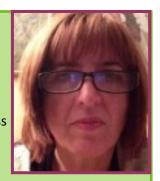

<u>Library Resources for Mental Health and</u>

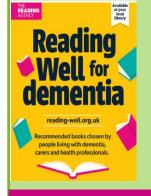
Wellbeing

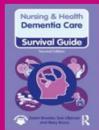

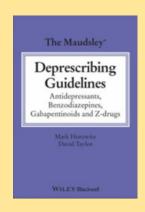

The Maudsley Deprescribing Guidelines

Oxford Health Libraries have recently purchased print copies of this title. This book details the guidelines for safely reducing or stopping antidepressants, benzodiazepines, gabapentinoids and z-drugs for patients, including step-by-step guidance for all commonly used medications, covering common pitfalls and troubleshooting.

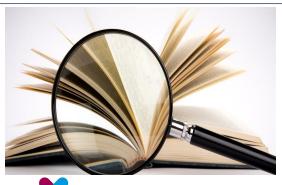
