Can primary care reduce emergency hospital attendances?

Helping people to get same-day GP appointments and making sure extended hours match the times when people are most likely to need care, could reduce pressure on hospital emergency services.

Minor updates to existing tool. These quick reference tools describe when to consider a UTI in: women aged under 65 years, adults aged over 65 years and adults with a urinary catheter who have a suspected CAUTI.

Interventions to Address Potentially Inappropriate Prescribing for Older Primary Care Patients: A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis
