Recent Evidence from Primary Care

People need support to keep weight off after treatment ends

Under the new NICE guidance, healthcare teams should monitor people for at least a year after they complete treatment and offer extra support if needed. This could include practical advice from programmes like NHS Better Health on changing daily habits or making adjustments at home or work to avoid slipping back.

When and how should clinicians taper benzodiazepines when the risks outweigh the benefits?

When the harms of continued benzodiazepine (BZD) use outweigh the benefits, clinicians should implement individualized, gradual tapering plans using shared decision-making, with attention to withdrawal risk and the need for psychosocial support. Abrupt discontinuation should be avoided in physically dependent patients.
