Recent Evidence from Primary Care

Brewing Beneath the Surface: The Link Between Psoriasis and Cardiovascular Disease

Demonstrated a statistically significant reduction in PASI scores following statin treatment, suggesting a potential benefit of statins in managing psoriasis.. It is difficult to untangle which comes first—the skin manifestations of psoriasis or the dysfunctional underlying metabolic and cardiovascular risk factors. The real answer... is most likely a complex combination of both.

Bipolar disorder: assessment and management

Update to NICE guidelines include a new recommendation that boys and men should be advised to use effective contraception (condoms, plus contraception used by a female sexual partner) throughout the valproate treatment period and for 3 months after stopping valproate.
