### Frequently asked questions

#### Q: Do I have to make an appointment?

A: Preferably to ensure social distancing can be maintained. Call the NHS 111 number or one of the units directly for triage and to arrange an approximate arrival time. If you present to the unit without an appointment you may be asked to return at a later time to be seen by one of the team.

#### Q: Do I need to wear a face covering?

A: Yes. In line with government guidance all staff, patients and visitors are required to wear a face covering when in the hospital setting. Please highlight any concerns to our reception team.

# Q: Can a friend or family member come into the MIU/FAU with me?

A: Wherever possible, we ask adults to attend alone and children with one designated care giver. Those who may need additional support can be accompanied. Please highlight any concerns to our reception team

# Q: What if the x-ray service is closed when I attend?

A: You will be fully assessed by the emergency practitioner. If an x-ray is required an appointment to attend the next day will be arranged. If there is a more urgent concern and returning the next day is not appropriate, onward referral to the local ED will be arranged.



Minor injury and first aid units (MIUs and FAUs)

### MIUs and FAUs

If your injury is not serious, you can get help from a minor injuries unit (MIU) or first aid unit (FAU), rather than going to an emergency department (ED).

The units are run by specialist emergency practitioners who have extended skills in the management of injury care.

These are located at the following community hospitals:

The three MIUs have x-ray facilities which are available at varying times. **Please call ahead for advice on x-ray availability.**

#### Minor injuries units can treat:

- sprains and strains
- suspected broken bones
- traumatic wound infections
- minor burns and scalds
- minor head injuries without loss of consciousness
- insect and animal bites
- minor eye injuries e.g. scratch/foreign body
- injuries to the back, shoulder and chest

#### Minor injuries units cannot treat:

- chest pain
- breathing difficulties
- major injuries including neck, spine, hip and pelvis
- stomach pains
- gynecological problems
- pregnancy problems
- allergic reactions
- overdoses
- alcohol related problems
- mental health problems
- conditions likely to require hospital admission
- issues already receiving care from a GP

It is important that you receive the right type of care for your condition and it may be that the MIU/FAU is not the right place for you to be seen.

## There is no resident doctor on duty at the MIUs/FAUs.

If you are unsure whether the MIU/FAU can help you please dial 111; you will receive advice and support about your condition and how to access appropriate care.

- chest pain
