Emergency Department Psychiatric Service Information for patients

About us

The Emergency Department Psychiatric Service (EDPS) is a team of mental health professionals based at the John Radcliffe Hospital. We assess people with psychiatric and psychological issues arriving at the Emergency Department. This leaflet provides you with information about what to expect from our service.

What to expect from us

Out of concern for your mental wellbeing, a member of staff from the Emergency Department has referred you to our team for assessment.

Your assessment by us will be in a private interview room where you can talk about any issues you have been experiencing. We will talk to you about your understanding of any problems and explore the different methods of coping with these issues.

We will tell you about follow-up services and tell you how to access these. You can raise any queries or concerns with us at any point during the assessment.

We will also ask if you have any family members, friends or carers who you would like to be involved in your assessment. We will always speak to you alone initially, so that you can discuss any concerns confidentially.

Confidentiality

Staff will keep the details of your care confidential. However, we also have a duty of care to share certain medical information about you with your GP practice, the team at the John Radcliffe Hospital or secondary mental health services and social services where appropriate. If you would like to know more about this please ask a member of the team.

Research

We work closely with the Oxford Centre for Suicide Research by supporting self-harm and suicide studies. Statistical information about your visit today may be used to help us to improve the service we provide by putting research into practice. Any information used will be treated confidentially and stored securely in line with Oxford Health NHS Foundation Trust policy. Please speak to a member of the team if you would like to know more about our research links.
