



How you will get your vaccine if you go to a vaccine centre.



- The NHS will contact you and ask you to book an appointment.
- They might write to you or call you.



- You might be invited to have your vaccine at you GP surgery.
- Or you might be asked to go to a Vaccine centre.



- You can have a carer or family member with you if you need to.



-On the day of appointment :

- Wear a short sleeved T-shirt to make it easier to have your vaccine.



- Check the time of your appointment



- Check you ou have a mask to wear. If you are able to wear one.



- Take something you like to do with you.



At the vaccine centre

A person will be at the door who will check your name and the time of your appointment.

They will ask you if

- You are feeling well today.
- They will ask if you have had a covid test recently or been asked to isolate.



-You will need to wear a mask during your appointment if you can.

-If you are early or the centre is busy they may ask you to wait in your car or outside.



-When it is time for your appointment you will go upstairs.

-There is a lift if needed.



-There will be a reception desk.

-They will ask your name, address and date of birth.



-You will be asked to take a seat.

You will be asked to go through to see a nurse. If you have someone with you they can come with you.



-They will ask you some questions.

-They will check you want to have the vaccine.



- You will then be called in to have your vaccine.
- If you have someone with you they can go in with you.



- You can listen to music, use your ipad or read a book if it helps.



- When you have had your vaccine you can go home.



- If you need to there are some seats you can use if you need to rest after having your vaccine.



- When you feel ready you can go home.



- You will still need to :
- keep washing your hands.
 - Wear a mask in shops and on public transport.
 - Stay 2 m from people you don't live with.
