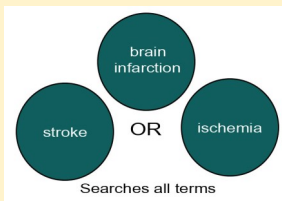
Let me save you time by finding the evidence for you. Here are some examples of searches that I have already carried out :

## Searching Tips



*Use OR to make your search more inclusive and think of as many synonyms as possible e.g. "pain relief" or analgesia or NSAIDs or paracetamol (Remember last month's tip to use "" when searching for a phrase!) This is especially important if you are carrying out a systematic review or any type of thorough search.*
