

Idioms

Cut out the picture cards below. First put them face up on the table, and see how many of them the student has heard before. To help the student reflect, you can use the idiom in context, e.g. 'The teacher asks the class whether they are finding the work difficult, and one student says 'It's a piece of cake!'. What does the student mean?

You can then play a pairs game matching the idioms to their meanings to help the student learn idioms they are less familiar with.

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Keep your eyes peeled	Look carefully
I'll have a nose around	I'll explore
I'm having a whale of a time	I'm having a good time
My eyes are bigger than my stomach	I've eaten too much
It's just sour grapes	She's jealous
A feather in your cap	Something to be proud of
Sick as a dog	Very upset



Raining cats and dogs	Raining heavily
Hold your horses	Slow down
Butterflies in my stomach	Nervous/frightened
Keep it under your hat	Keep it a secret/keep quiet about it
I'm tied up at the moment	I'm busy at the moment
Put a sock in it	Be quiet
Pull yourself together	Control yourself/calm down



I shot myself in the foot	I did something that made the situation worse
I'm fed up	I'm bored
He's a pain in the neck	He's a nuisance
Break the ice	Get to know each other
Get lost	Go away
Don't jump down her throat	Don't be cross with her
His bark is worse than his bite	He may sound unfriendly, but he isn't

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I'm shaking in my boots	I'm frightened
You're going to have to face the music	You will have to accept the consequences of what you've done
