#### Why did we need a BOB Wound Care Formulary



BOB ICB was established as a **Statutory** body in July 2022. It comprises of three localities:

- Buckinghamshire
- Oxfordshire &
- Berkshire West

Each locality had a wound care formulary which had been agreed and ratified by their individual Area Prescribing Committees, at the time the formularies were created.

In coming together as BOB ICB, there was a need to align and create a BOB Wound Care Formulary to ensure continuity of high-quality wound management underpinned by a wound care formulary which was responsive to the wound care needs of the population of BOB ICB which delivered

- Best outcomes &
- Cost effective for the NHS

# How was the BOB Wound Care Formulary Approved

- The proposed formulary was submitted to the Medicines Optimisation Team Governance Group (MOTGG) which acts as a 'sub committee' of the main Area Prescribing Committee (APC).
- The APC is the ICB's formulary decision group. It is this group's responsibility to make decisions about which medicines and appliances the ICB can include in the BOB Prescribing Formulary.
- There is a robust governance process in deciding which products can be included in the prescribing formulary
- The Medicines Optimisation Team works closely with clinicians to ensure the most cost-effective products which deliver the best clinical outcomes and value for the NHS are proposed to be included in the formulary
- Formularies are reviewed periodically to ensure that the products continue to deliver best value for the NHS.
- Periodic changes are also necessary to address changes in product availability.
- All wound care formulary changes must go through the MOTG once again.




